Doug Bailey introduced our program: Chris Brooks, "First Things First, Protecting Kids and Families." Chris works full time on the faculty of North Central University. He teaches Youth and Community Development in the Center for Youth and Leadership. He is a values-driven leader who has provided leadership in the social/non-profit sector. He is a passionate advocate for economic justice and the well being of children, youth and families.

He spoke about today's youth culture. We are seeing youth culture earlier, called juvenile adolescent, and lasting longer, called adult adolescent. Kids in their twenties are still living at home, playing games, no plans. Kids need support from four areas for their development. Many aren't receiving any support, and that is why they create problems for society. His recommendation for parents with a kid that has disconnected is to find an area of activity that they like, even if the parent doesn't, to use that to connect. He said you have to go where the kid is, not where you are. Communication was most important, showing the kids that you care. Be involved. Leadership rises and falls on relationships and relationships are everything.

Scott MacDonald thanked Chris for his presentation, and **President Steve** rang the bell, bringing our meeting to a close and sending us into the blizzard.
