A number of Edina Rotarians were in attendance to hear from Gary and were able to see firsthand the passion and energy he has for Rotary. President Gary has lived in Evanston, IL, for two years and travels all over the world meeting some of the 1.2 million Rotarians who are united in our motto of "Service Above Self."

Ron Kalich gave his classification talk. Ron grew up in the Pittsburgh area and identified himself as a third-generation patriotic American. He is a life-long Steelers fan and married to the love of his life, Maria. Ron got an MBA from Pitt and a law degree. WOW! Ron started at Westinghouse in the nuclear power unit. After a successful career there, he went on to private equity in New York. Ron is now retired and is a business consultant who sits on several boards. Mayor Jim Hovland introduced our speaker, Jarret Brachman, who spoke on the topic "The New Era of Global Jihadism." Jarret has been called the "Laptop James Bond" and the "information warrior." Jarret posed the question, "Are these terrorists still Muslim?" From the Boston Bombers to the ax-wielding terrorist in New York, these terrorists were characterized as lone wolves, or maybe "loon" wolves. They were motivated by Al Quaeda senior leadership. Now we have the new beast of ISIS. They are worse than anything we've ever seen. (They are completely off the reservation.) Jarrett mentioned that these terrorists are getting much dumber and way more violent. Their rhetoric is only marginally cloaked in religion. They started with very low standards and have worked their way down.

Social media has been a godsend for ISIS. There are more than 500 hours of content in just the last month. These videos are Hollywood quality and include mass beheadings. (These are like horror films, only worse.) They also include footage of kids conducting executions and pushing gay people off rooftops. They customize their global ideology for specific regions and try to challenge your manhood and your sense of religious duty. They appeal to the disenfranchised youth who feel like failures and hate their government, kids who are angry at authority and angry at the government.

In conclusion, this is a pervasive threat that is only getting worse. Sue Spalding thanked Jarret for his jolting presentation.

Jeff Ohe closed the meeting with a quote from Ghandi that basically said "the terrorists always fail." How appropriate!

After the meeting, Mike Opitz and I got together to discuss Jeff's RVR number (Rotary Viewer Rating). We both agreed it is going in the right direction and is now up to 6.78, only .4 behind past presidents Steve Slyce and Scott MacDonald. Good work Jeff!

Financial Report

The financial statements for the Club and Foundation were reviewed and found in good order.

Committee Reports

Community Service (Grants):

- Grant reviews are in process. Adopted a new form, fillable PDF, to review grants uniformly. Recommendations will be presented to the club and ERF boards next month.
- Discussion held and affirmed that committee grant recommendations should continue to be discussed at club board meeting.

Community Service (Projects):

- Holiday Gift Giving Program: Another successful holiday gift-giving program led by Jean Morrison.
- Salvation Army Bell Ringing: Led by Dan Hallberg and Wayne Harmon and raised \$5,766.
- Jeremiah House: Scheduled for April 9.
- Feed My Starving Children: Scheduled for 9 to 11 a.m. Saturday, May 2, and 9 to 11 a.m. Saturday, Oct. 3.

International Service:

- ERF approved \$15,000 Uganda project.
- Honduras Water project: A \$6 million-plus project in partnership with Water Missions International in the pipeline. Potentially our club will lead, with \$25,000 a year for five years. Most likely to be a district-wide project. Non-Rotarian donations are expected. This project is accessible for service trips.

Membership (Recruitment):

- Current membership stands at 159. Doing well with new members, but have had larger than usual member resignations.
- Greg Yoch was approved as a new member. His classification is Custom Business Décor.
- Member resignations: Michael Braun and Kurt Eckstrom.
- Member leave of absence approved for Ann Goebel.
- Five prospective members in pipeline.
- Diplomats are reaching out to individuals with low attendance and low involvement.

- Getting 10 to 20 prospects per quarterly Prospective Member Day.
- Steve Slyce encouraged recognizing members who achieve perfect attendance, Paul Harris, etc.

Membership (Retention):

- Motown...The Musical was a success, great fun had by all who attended.
- Bowling night is Jan. 31 at Tuttle's in Hopkins.
- Fireside Chats planned for April.

Public Relations:

- Social Media Training: Kaylin Eidsness will hold training in February to encourage membership to post tweets promoting our club.
- Club website update: PR is considering ways to have committee members updating posts on website.

The Rotary Foundation:

- Member participation and donation in giving to TRF is ahead of last year. Our club objective for TRF remains "Every Rotarian, every year." One way is to inform and encourage new members to take advantage of matching points for PHF with a first-time donation of \$333.
- Our club was recognized at last week's RI President Gary Huang's dinner at the St. Paul Hotel as having the highest per capita and largest number of Paul Harris Society members in our district, District 5950.

Youth Service:

- STRIVE: Additional mentors needed.
- Youth Exchange: Mike Kallas will coordinate exchange students country talks for this spring with leff Ohe.
- Interact: Mark Jessen noted bumps in getting Interact off the ground. Start may be deferred until next year.
