She also educated us about where her efforts are spent in India. We have given them money towards a bus for their orphanage. This has provided transportation to disabled and for vocational training. We also granted her foundation money towards an ambulance. They have used that many times.

Their biggest focus now is on a group called Nari Gunjan, a group that empowers women through education.

Tim Murphy came to the podium and educated us about how Edina Rotary is a huge contributor to organizations and Rotary International. We happen to be within the top 10 of 500 districts, and 32,000 Rotary clubs. He honored Jeff and Alley Ohe for becoming Major Donors.

Andrew Zimmern is a chef, author, and three-time James Beard Award winner as a host, creator and executive producer of Bizarre Foods and Bizarre Foods America on the Travel Channel. He has written four books and is a contributing editor at Food & Wine Magazine, Delta Sky Magazine, and Minneapolis-St. Paul Magazine.

Andrew took the podium and started out by acknowledging the Rotary organization and the service we all give. He believes in

creating an atmosphere of grace and sending the message about service.

Andrew chooses to focus on what we have in common instead of our differences. He believes in entrepreneurship, and turning that into something plentiful. Entrepreneurship helps build the spirit of giving. Through service and giving, people get the tools they need to succeed and be a participating member of society.

Andrew himself is involved in a handful of organizations. He is passionate and helps promote awareness on world poverty and hunger. A recent example is his participation with the Twin Cities Salvation Army in helping promote how the non-profit organization works to bring nutritious food to those in need.

He is involved in The One Foundation that U2's singer Bono cofounded. The One is a campaign to make poverty history; an advocacy and campaigning organization dedicated to fighting extreme poverty and preventable disease in Africa.

Lastly, he recently posted support to "Zaaaap World Hunger" in an effort to bring electricity to Africa. Through his travel in Africa, he has witnessed a large amount of meat and vegetables rotting. The biggest issue is food collection, storage and distribution of the foods. That can't get better without reliable

Energy is the first step to bridging the enormous gap between the farm and table. More than a billion people don't have electricity. Something we, in the United States, take for granted. Agriculture depends on reliable energy for irrigation, refrigeration, food processing, and transportation. Andrew has taken his experience about seeing the vast gap between those who have and those who don't and get involved.

Andrew spoke about why he chose to make a television show and have it on Travel Channel vs. PBS. He simply wanted the exposure of reaching more people. Andrew believes in telling stories, and the best stories are ones we have not heard.

Andrew's show is about different cultures and the food they eat. It's an entertainment piece about people we may not have everyday contact with, but draws the audience in through shared humanity. Food is something we can all identify with.

Andrew is asked dozens of times a day what his worst food experience has been. He answered by saying he chooses to be a good ambassador. When he is in a small village in the middle of nowhere and they make him a fermented blood pudding in his honor, he smiles, and chooses to remain gracious.

Andrew and his wife, Risha, have a son, Noah, and live in Edina.
