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# A Note from the President

One of the crown jewels of Edina Rotary, and a big part of our legacy of service, has been our involvement in Camp Enterprise. Camp E is the story of clubs and Rotarians working together to serve youth. The goal is to develop the next generation of leaders and it is done through an intensive three-day camp at YMCA Camp Ihduhapi.



Camp E was originally brought to Minnesota from Ohio by the Alexandria Rotary Club in 1978. Three years later it was moved to the Twin Cities and adopted by Edina Rotary, and then later by Edina Morningside Rotary Club. Last year, approximately 60 Rotary clubs sponsored 120 students from 60 high schools across Minnesota and Wisconsin. Clubs identify their local students and provide the scholarships for their students to attend. Once camp starts, everyone is in for a fantastic experience as they learn about the free enterprise system and leadership development. Each student participates in a variety of new and challenging activities and is able to dive into areas that really interest them. The camp would not be possible without the nearly 100 Rotary volunteers representing over a dozen clubs. Rotarians are keynote speakers, mentors, business specialists, venture capitalists, essay readers, and planners.

At the District 5950 Conference held Saturday, May 16, at the Mall of America and the Radisson Blu, awards were handed out to clubs in our District in three categories: Youth Service, International Service, and Community Service. Our club, along with EMRC, won first place in the Youth Service category for our work on Camp Enterprise. Each of the first-place winners were able to show a short video of their project, and John Flynn put together a well-done video about Camp E. The chair for this year's camp is Kip Peterson, and camp will run from Nov. 5–7, 2015. Kip is holding a meeting for volunteers in the Community Room at Edina City Hall Tuesday, June 9, from 5 to 6:30 p.m. If you've never volunteered at Camp Enterprise, check it out!

#### 2015 Women in Leadership Award

With Mother's Day and the fishing opener, May is a month which historically focuses on women. Thinking globally...in worldwide news, Pope Francis canonized four new saints this week...all women. One French, one Italian, and two who are Palestinian. Acting locally...our Rotary Club is taking time to celebrate women leaders here in Edina.

After a very long ovation cheering the date of July I because it marks the starting date for our new president, Jennifer Bennerotte took to the podium to cover some Rotary history and introduce Chrysanne Manoles. Our President-Elect recounted that Rotary International was a men's only organization from 1905 to 1989. Rotarians in California led the way before it was official when they elected Sylvia Whitlock, the first woman Rotary club president, in 1987.

Our club was also ahead of the curve in 1988 when we welcomed our first female member, Chrysanne Manoles. In 2001, Patti Ellingson-Solheim served our club as our first female president. Past President Sandy Schley served as our Rotary District's first female District Governor.

Nationwide, women make up 27 percent of Rotarians. Even though we are the No. I Club in the Universe, our Club is a bit lower at 20 percent. With great people like President-Elect Jennifer Bennerotte, Chrysanne, Patti, and Sandy, we are well served in quality and character beyond any numeric metric.

We have recently added three new women members to help increase our percentages: Edina Chamber of Commerce Volunteer of the year Leann Stessman; Shelly Loberg, who was officially welcomed today; and freshly approved this morning by the board as a member, Libby Schmit.

Leading up to honoring our 2015 Women in Leadership award winner, Chrysanne Manoles recognized John Flynn for his Camp E leadership and Jerry Potter for his Leadership Ethics Seminar for Edina High School students.

And the 2015 Women in Leadership honoree is....Kris Marshall, Connecting with Kids director. Kris has made a great impact with the Edina Community Foundation in her first two years serving as director of the Connecting with Kids program. She gave thanks to all of her family, friends, and co-workers. Many were present at our meeting to celebrate her honor today.

When Kim joined her husband's business, Robert Foote Jeweler, she engaged in virtually every committee in the 50th & France Business and Professional Association. Serving as a board member and treasurer since 2011, Kim strengthened the organization by establishing a budget and focusing their purpose.

Kim encouraged all of us to use our natural talents.

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### 50<sup>th</sup> & France update

There are over 175 business served by the 50<sup>th</sup> & France Business and Professional Association. A spring classic...the Edina Art Fair will be June 5-7, and a new event called "Open Streets" will be this fall on Sept. 27.

Parking and sidewalk improvements have recently been completed in the area. Bright LED lighting, fresh paint, more disability parking, and muchneeded structural repairs have extended the life of the ramps for another 25 to 30 years.

Rotarians had some questions, such as plans for the former Hooten Cleaners site—a combination retail and parking development is in the works.

Wooj Byun stressed the need for affordable housing for City of Edina employees within Edina's city limits.

Nate Wenner thanked the speakers and presented a donation to VEAP in their honor. Wooj was also acknowledged for volunteering to send in the first, and very generous, check for his housing plan.

We are waiting for your emails of "Yes I want to be a host family!" and "Yes, I know someone who would be a great host family!"



#### **Public Relations:**

- The chair role on the PR committee is being transitioned to the new chair Mark Jessen. Doug Johnson's term ends June 25.
- Mark is working with the Edina 4th of July Parade Sub-Committee (Jennifer Bennerotte, David Hatzung [chair], and Ann Platt). The Club will again sponsor the Super Heroes unit and will likely have cars for the incoming president, possibly the "Club Hero," and the incoming District Governor Tim Murphy. Candy and pencils will likely be the give away. More to come...
- The Board voted to keep using Aaron to record meetings and do the needed tech work (sound, PowerPoint, etc.). There will be an increase in cost in order for the City, who employs Aaron, to cover their costs. The Board may consider other options moving forward.

- Jennifer Bennerotte shared a memo from Kaylin Eidsness about future charges for graphic arts work. At this point, committees will need to budget for their own projects. Committees may use other sources (work related, etc.) but are advised to maintain the current branding.
- Mark lessen has asked for assistance with securing new committee members that have social media skills and also is seeking additional photographers to help John Flynn.

#### The Rotary Foundation:

- Members who have not contributed are being contacted.
- President Ohe noted there is still confusion between the Edina Rotary Foundation (ERF) and The Rotary Foundation (TRF) and encouraged the committee to find ways to achieve better understanding of the difference.

#### Youth Service:

- Jeff Ohe and Mike Opitz attended the Edina High School scholarship event and presented two \$1,000 scholarships on behalf of the Club. They commented that this is a great event and a wonderful way of supporting students in our community.
- Our two Youth Exchange students will arrive in mid-August. Host families are needed.
- STRIVE is looking for a person to lead the program to replace Terry Stevens.

#### **Officer Reports**

- Ann Platt asked that all budget recommendations for 2015–2016 be turned in to her no later than Friday, May
- Jennifer Bennerotte shared that the new board discussion of possible signature projects went well. The top I to 3 will be determined by the Community Service Committee, with recommendations going back to the Board. She will be attending the International Rotary Conference in Brazil. New Board training will be June 1.
- Jeff Ohe recommended that Joe Christensen remain on the ERF Board for one more year. He is delighted to report that Jerry Potter was recognized with the Rotary Club of Edina "Hero" Award at the District 5950 Conference. In addition, the Club received first place along with Edina Morningside Rotary Club for the top Youth Service Project, Camp Enterprise. June 25 will be the transition meeting.
