Josh Sprague, our membership director and Edina Rotarian since 2008, introduced our speaker, R.T. Rybak. R.T., which stands for Raymond Thomas, had a 30-year career in journalism before running for the mayor of Minneapolis. He was elected in his first attempt and stayed for 12 years. He thanked all of us for the great work we do every day as Rotarians. He also commented on the tremendous partnership he had with Edina Mayor Jim Hovland when he was in office.

Rybak said that the Twin Cities have a huge crisis in front of us-the largest achievement gap in education for students of color than any other major city in the country. He feels that the increasing diversity of our community will be cause for us to be a dominant economic force in the future. Rybak said that our community has a tremendous capacity to solve the achievement gap with our big hearts, big wallets, and great compassion, but we need to get everyone aligned.

He said that some of the keys are to:

- 1. Have every child ready for kindergarten by having all children screened by age of 3.
- 2. Have every child reading by second grade.
- 3. Have every child proficient at math by fifth grade.

Minneapolis and St. Paul are blessed with children speaking hundreds of languages, Rybak said. We need to work to get those children into the work force.

Tim Murphy thanked Rybak for his presentation and all that he does to minimize the educational achievement gap in our community.


