over the years. Patti Ellingson-Solheim and her sister, Jane Ellingson Ehresmann, both past presidents, respectively, of the two clubs, provided a brief history of the cooperation between the clubs on a variety of service projects, such as the Thanksgiving Basket Assembly. Bob Solheim gave an entertaining demonstration of how one might efficiently prepare a turkey for Thanksgiving. Bob did not indicate whether he would be willing to repeat his dazzling feat in the homes of members on Nov. 27.

In the spirit of the season, we were entertained by two welldressed giant turkeys, who were demonstrating on behalf of a Vegetarian Thanksgiving.

Program Chair **Tim Murphy**, introduced our speaker, Mary Beth Growney Selene. A successful business leader, Mary Beth was welcomed to the podium with a standing ovation in recognition of her outstanding work on behalf of Rotary International.

Our speaker described various important initiatives of The Rotary Foundation and said that key words associated with Rotary, such as, fun, vibrant, active, involved, committed, friendly and welcoming, all apply to our two clubs.

She indicated that The Rotary Foundation, with its three-year Annual Fund cycle, employs a unique operating model. The areas of the Foundation's focus are the prevention of disease, conflict resolution, improving family health, and access to education and literacy. Its number-one priority continues to be the eradication of polio. The remaining hot spots for polio are Nigeria, Afghanistan, and Pakistan, and we cannot quit until the number of new cases is zero. She described The Rotary Foundation as "the greatest foundation in the world."

During the Q&A period, our speaker reported on her specific duties as a director, including helping to oversee the various scholarship programs of Rotary. Rotary scholarship recipients should exhibit the core values of leadership, fellowship, integrity and service. They also typically address the Foundation's areas of focus and such Rotary International priorities as clean water, sanitation, and economic development.

Tom Ries thanked our speaker, and after the introduction of our District Governor, Jim Nelson, the meeting was adjourned.

Sixty-four EHS students and 29 Rotarians and volunteers participated in an all-day seminar on leadership ethics. The event, cochaired this fall by Jerry Potter and Joe Hayes, was held for the third time, moving from the spring to the fall for the 2014-2015 school year.

Held in conjunction with Edina High School 212 Leadership, the seminar was held at the Church of St. Patrick in Edina. The purpose of the seminar was to discuss and assist the EHS students on the study of ethics of why we believe the acts of right or wrong and exhibiting ethical and moral conduct at all times can lead to fulfilling life.

The format was 10 tables of six students and two table leaders.
