Ann Platt encouraged everyone to attend the Veterans Luncheon from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, Nov.11, at the Edina Country Club. Members can bring two veterans whose meals will be paid for by the club.

Jeff Ohe awarded **Chuck** and Peggy **Agan** with the Major Donor Award. They were our 31st Major Donor Award recipients. They have supported humanitarian programs by donating over \$10,000.

Steve Slyce introduced new member **Brian Miller** and officially inducted him into the club. Brian was sponsored by **Josh Sprague**.

Buzz Bainbridge introduced our speaker. Buzz's classification is Corporate Training Consultant. Buzz runs 3.5 miles every day and was a member of the University of Colorado ski team. He's been a member of Edina Rotary since 2006 and works for TRACOM Group.

Buzz introduced Brian Olson, Public Works Director for the City of Edina. Brian talked about what is Public Works, the services offered by Edina Public Works Services, future challenges and key successes by the Public Works Department.

Some of the highlights included how Public Works services 230 miles of roadway, pothole patching, irrigation system repairs, almost 1,000 crosswalk blocks, 200 miles of water mains, mowing over 40 parks and overseeing 2,000 light poles, plus much, much more. Brian pointed out how they used to sealcoat the streets internally but have found it's much more cost effective to contract this service out.

He mentioned that they had over 1,000 Gopher One requests this past year. And shared that Mayor Jim Hovland is the official "Weed Inspector."

Edina has an outstanding reputation for its snowplowing services. The biggest challenge is balancing operation and maintenance with capital improvement. The majority of the infrastructure was built between 1950 and 1970. Total replacement cost is over a half billion dollars. Public Works job is to extend the life! One of Brian's final comments was the Edina infrastructure is getting older and we need to invest in it.

John MacLennan thanked the speaker and President Jennifer Bennerotte adjourned the meeting.
