Jason has been married for 17 years, has 2 sons and says he knows more about makeup than his wife. He wakes up every morning at 2:28 a.m. (because those 2 minutes make a difference), he is out the door at 3, and he usually gets to the station at 3:30 from his home in Maple Grove. He practices for a half hour, and honestly, there are just nursing mothers and crazy people up then; but by 5 a.m., the real people are awake, he said.
