- On the first Wednesday of every month, Kip Peterson will be leading a new initiative called "member social/vocational hour." It will be held from 5:30 to 7 p.m. at Makers Café. More information will be sent to all members.
- The next Prospective Member Day will be Oct. 30. The emphasis will be on potential women members.

#### **Community Service (Projects):**

- The next Jeremiah House event will be Sept. 23.
- Twenty-three members have expressed interest in participating in the VEAP food initiative.
- Feed My Starving Children will be Oct. 25 and will be the Club's event to participate in Edina Day of Service.
- Thanksgiving baskets will be assembled on Nov. 26 beginning at 11:45 a.m. at the Edina Country Club.

#### Youth Service:

- Camp RYLA needs a new chair with current chair, Mike Ogle, on a leave of absence.
- Interact is up and running at Edina High School. Sixty students signed up. Mark Jessen is coordinating for our Club.
- Youth Exchange is going well. Wooj Byun is the current host from our Club. We continue to seek new host families. Note that these can be non-Rotarian.

#### **International Service:**

- Dan Mott has joined the group.
- There is a request from the International Village Clinic for \$500 to \$1,000. Our Club has supported them in the past. This request will be presented to the Edina Rotary Foundation Board.
- A request will be coming from the San Felipe, Mexico, cataract surgery project.

#### Club Service (Administration):

The front desk is going great. A plan is being developed to better process guests on the Prospective Member

#### Membership (Retention):

- The first two Fireside Chats went well. There are three more scheduled. The committee will be discussing how to best do the chats and maximize attendance.
- A Club outing is scheduled for Dec. 22 to see Motown—the Musical at the Orpheum Theater. To date 37 have signed up. The committee would like a minimum of 40. Tickets are limited and are only \$65 if purchased now. Michael Stanzak is coordinating.

Wooj Byun represented our Club in this process. Jennifer is recommending that Doug Johnson organize a meeting of our members to meet with a facilitator from the city to review and provide input to the four scenarios that the Vision Edina team is suggesting.


