of success and execution. This disengagement costs companies anywhere between \$25,000 and \$150,000 of staff productivity.

Lesson No. 2: Be who you are. Be yourself, it's genuine and natural. When you aren't the "right fit, you can't be in tune!" If you hired Bentley to be a guard dog, you would be greatly disappointed because his breed is too friendly. So make sure you're in a role that's true to yourself.

Lesson No. 3: Unleash your talents and practice. When we're the right fit, we can do what we do best and unleash our natural talents.

Lesson No. 4: Shake it off and pick up your poop. This is about emotional intelligence, personal accountability and forgiveness and letting go. Results are faster when we forgive and forget and hold ourselves accountable when we need to.

Lesson No. 5: Be a guide dog for others. When you relax, help others and focus on your talents, you're being a leader.

Matt Boockmeier thanked Robb for his great presentation and let him know that the Club will make a donation to VEAP in honor of his time.

Jeff Ohe closed the meeting with a quote from Abraham Lincoln "Things may come to those who wait, but only the things left by those who hustle."
