# ROTARY DISTRICT CONFERENCE – APRIL 15 AND 16.

The main site for these events if the Prom Center, located in Oakdale (MN) just east of St Paul. The Friday noon speaker is Alan C. Page, Minnesota's first African-American Supreme Court Justice. Page is widely renowned for his former career as a professional football player. Elected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1988, he is best known for his defensive efforts with Minnesota Vikings in the 1970s.

Friday afternoon speaker and author Rick Olson will tell you how to "Unleash your Greatness: Becoming a Person of Impact." Afterwards you can choose from two break-out sessions. One features Past Rotary International Director Jerry Meigs who will lead a creative discussion on "The Future of Rotary." The other session spotlights "The History of the California Wine Industry" with expert Tom Check. An industry specialist will offer red and white varieties for your enjoyment.

An hour of great and meet "Fellowship Time" precedes a "Celebratory Dinner" served by nationally acclaimed Prom Center Catering.

Post-dinner entertainment is through the Great American History Theatre. Its world premier performance highlights Rotary's first 100 years.

Your evening concludes with music, games, a dessert bar, and expanded fellowship.

Saturday morning there is a breakfast and stimulating discussion of "Table Topics" on 18 to 20 subjects like Polio Plus and Foundation Giving, RYLA and Group Study Exchange.

You'll be inspired by the morning keynoters, Tom Cody and Willow Sweeney, of Top 20 Training. Then visit with youth exchange students and group study exchange team members.

At the concluding luncheon, you'll enjoy the always exciting and exuberant, multi-cultural entertainment provided by the Youth Exchange students.

- 1905 First Rotary club organized in Chicago, Illinois, USA
- 1908 Second club formed in San Francisco, California
- **1910** First Rotary convention held in Chicago
- 1912 The Rotary Club of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, becomes the first club outside the United States to be officially chartered.
- 1917 Endowment fund, forerunner of The Rotary Foundation, established
- **1932** 4-Way Test formulated by Chicago Rotarian Herbert J. Tayloro
- 1947 Rotary founder Paul Harris dies; first 18 Rotary Foundation scholarships granted
- 1962 First Interact club formed in Melbourne, Florida
- 1978 RI's largest convention, with 39,834 registrants, held in Tokyo
- 1985 Rotary announces PolioPlus program to immunize all the children of the world against polio
- 1989 Council on Legislation opens Rotary membership to women worldwide
- 1990 Rotary Club of Moscow chartered first club in Soviet Union
- 1994 Western Hemisphere declared polio-free
- 2000 Western Pacific declared polio-free
- 2001 30,000th Rotary club chartered
- **2002** Europe declared polio-free; first class of 70 Rotary Peace Scholars begin study
- 2003 Rotarians raise more than \$118 million to support the final stages of polio eradication
- 2005 Rotary celebrates 100 years!
