ROTATION DAY – APRIL 26

What happens for Rotation Day?

All members either host or are assigned a place to go for lunch. This goes back to the early days of Rotary when Rotarians rotated their meeting site each week. It gives members the opportunity to get to know each other a little better and to learn about the host's occupation.

What is the host's responsibility?

Hosts sign-up and indicate the number of members they would like to accommodate for lunch. This can vary from a minimum of six members to whatever number the host can accommodate. Hosts are given a list of names of members to host and then invite their guests- giving directions, etc. The hosts order lunches. All members have already paid for their Rotation Day lunches with their dues so all the host has to do is submit a billing to the office for the lunches.

During the meeting time, 12–1:30 p.m., members can introduce themselves and the hosts can tell about their occupation and in some cases go on a tour of their facilities. They take attendance and turn it in to the office.
