Arc improves the quality of life for person with developmental disabilities and assists them in obtaining the full range of civil rights, including the right to equal education, housing, and employment.

Arc Southeastern Minnesota identifies gaps in the service system and leads collaborative efforts with other agencies and elected officials to find ways to close these gaps. Arc promotes the development of or provides new services so that people with developmental disabilities can live full and productive lives in their communities.


## **FOUR WAY TEST**

This year President Mike will follow the invocation at each meeting with the Four Way Test. Each member of your board will take a turn in leading the Four Way Test and after that the person doing the invocation will do it.

## What is the Four Way Test?

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is The 4-Way Test. It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 when he was asked to take charge of the Chicago-based Club Aluminum Company, which was facing bankruptcy. Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depression-caused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow in their business and professional lives. The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company was credited to this simple philosophy.

Herb Taylor became president of Rotary International during 1954-55. The 4-Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943 and has been translated into more than 100 languages and published in thousands of ways. The message should be known and followed by all Rotarians.


### **Attendance Requirements Review**

- You must attend or makeup 60% of the meetings in a six month period.
- You can make up at another club or at a scheduled home club event (board meetings, committee meetings, etc.) All of our community service events count also.
- If you go to another club meeting and find they have moved, it is valid to count this for attendance.
- Make up meetings count if they are within 2 weeks either side of the missed meeting.
