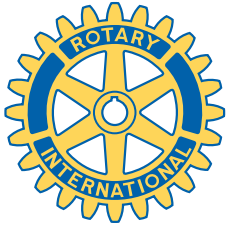

## Rotary Friendship Exchange to Taiwan!

For eight Rotarians and/or partners – the seventh RFE exchange for District 5960 is now arranged with Rotary District 3520 of Taiwan. This district is located in Taipei City, Taiwan, the Republic of China. We have received a "special invitation" to participate in the special Rotary Friendship Exchange program which is linked to the centennial celebration of the Republic of China which was established October 10, 1911. District 3520 was invited by the Government to participate by inviting 200 Rotarian/partners to visit Taiwan during the period of July 2011 through March 2012. Our district was one of 40 districts from around the world invited to send a RFE Team to Taiwan. This exchange is "special" as there will only be an Outbound Team sent from our District.



All visiting Rotarians will be assigned to Rotarian host families for home-stay during the duration of their visit. Member clubs of District 3520 will be assigned to discuss details of providing arrangements during the exchange.

Points of Interest: Centennial celebration activities/events, the National Palace Museum with the world's largest collection of Chinese historical artifacts, the beautiful scenery, the variety of Chinese cuisines, the intriguing night markets, the old temples and more. ## From the desk of Karel Weigel, Rochester Rotary President



It seems strange, but timely, that this will be my last, "From the President's Desk". It has been a privilege to serve as President of the Rotary Club of Rochester. I am always aware that I stand on the very tall shoulders of those who preceded me in this office and who are responsible for the growth and stability of the Club today. Thank you all!

I want to summarize the 2010-2011 Rotary year. Much has happened this year, new RI and District initiatives were implemented, new local programs were started, ongoing programs got a dose of enthusiasm from new volunteers, our membership grew and with it our volunteer base so increasingly we welcome new faces to volunteer events. We met the challenge of staffing transition in the Rotary office with the help of Lois Nietz and past president Bill Nietz until Elizabeth Karsell joined us in March. This has also been an active year for youth programs, for international visitors, and grant activity both global and District Matching grants.

**Rotary District Partnerships:** Our club implemented the Youth Protection policy with all members of the Board, all Rotarians who work with youth, (STRIVE, Rotary Readers and others becoming certified for working with youth.

**Rotary International Future Vision Pilot:** A change in focus and procedures from previous grants and scholarships. The outcome of the pilot shows a doubling or tripling of Global Grant Activity. Our SEMN World Community Service Committee has 4 active projects completing the District approval process and 2 completed projects (computers for Estonia and medical supplies for Ghana). We hosted two GSE/VTT teams, one from Argentina in April and an inbound team from Turkey in June. All of these efforts contribute to the positive increase in grant activity cited above.

**Youth Related Activity:** Youth related activities were a highlight this year and a continuation of what was begun last year. Tim Salazar and Karmen Reid returned from a Mexico trip with Youth Linc, our inbound Youth Exchange Student Camilla Kjaergaard arrived in August to begin her high school junior year at Lourdes. She stayed with host families, Stacy Vandenheuvel, Nicki Froiland, and Kim Adams and under the watchful eye of Vicki Allen the Youth Exchange coordinator. 4 high school students attended Camp RYLA and 2 new students were selected for the Youth Linc 2011-2012 Rotary year.

**Literacy:** Literacy is an RI focus area and one of special and enduring interest to Rotary Club of Rochester. STRIVE, Rotary Readers, Camp RYLA and the Reading Center and recipient of the Basketball impact Grant all help students in our community.

**Social events:** Some events are constructed to be social, but we never forget that any gathering of Rotarians is a social occasion. This year a new event was introduced, Oktoberfest. (Ein prosit). We helped usher in the autumnal equinox with the frost on the pumpkin and the froth in the glass. While Oktoberfest was well attended, we struggled with enough attendance in other events including the Progressive Dinner and the annual golf outing both of which had to be cancelled.

**Building our Community.** Many ongoing programs continue from one year to the next and our faithful volunteers help to meet needs at Channel One, Quarry Hill Fall Festival, Community Food Response, Salvation Army Bell Ringing, White Oaks Park, and Ronald McDonald House. This year an urgent special need was assisting with flood relief in Hammond. We continue to share out Rotary experience with each other and with those we serve. Service Above Self remains a primary value.

**Building our Club community.** Membership continues to grow and new initiatives to welcome and engage new members have begun. We created a separate board and bylaws for Rotary Club of Rochester Foundation. This provides consistent and focus oversight to the investments and helps manage the endowment. District Governor Craig Leiser made the annual visit in October and in honor of his love of orange, our membership sported orange ribbons and Craig was forced to sit behind a pumpkin with his likeness pasted to it. It was well received. For all the efforts of the committee, the members support of our club and RI Foundation we were awarded a **Presidential Citation With Distinction**. It is an honor shared by us all.

The Rotary year 2010-2011 comes to a close and with my thanks to all of you for allowing me to have the honor of serving as President of the Rotary Club of Rochester. Thank you, too, for your friendship and support. It is what makes this club special.

I leave you with a final thought: Being a Rotarian is a privilege to be shared with others in service and in friendship and with many through philanthropy.

# Hello from New Orleans, host of the 102nd Rotary International Convention

Wow! What a thrill to attend my first Rotary International Convention.

I must first say “thank you” for the opportunity to belong to such a wonderful organization.

Without Rick Lien’s persistence and your acceptance into Rotary, I doubt if I would have ever felt the excitement and commitment that Rotary has to share.

Bill Gaddis, the GRR president-elect, and I traveled together as we attended the Rotary International Convention in New Orleans, May 21-25. We were



supposed to leave Minneapolis on Saturday afternoon, but with a Minnesota lightning storm that took out power to four terminals, we didn’t arrive in New Orleans until 11:00 a.m. the following day, with the same clothes on that we had left our homes with on Saturday. Was this the start to our year we wondered?

So what do you do in an airport while waiting to fly standby? You sit in the local pub drinking a glass of water with barley and hops, and it was here that I meet two gentlemen who were on their way to the convention from



Korea. I noticed the Rotary pin they were wearing and asked them if they were on their way to New Orleans, and with the language barrier, I pointed to my pin and they asked “you Rotarian too?”

Our flight troubles were soon gone as Bill and I arrived at the Ernest N. Morial Convention Center (a mammoth building that held roughly 19,000 attendees) just an hour before the opening session was to begin. A sigh of relief was had as I sat there listening to the entertainment ready to embark on a new year.



When the session began I was amazed at all the people that Rotary brought together, and as the flag ceremony was being presented, I truly understood how Rotary is an International organization. There were countries I had never heard of before. When these countries were announced, the cheers that followed were evidence that Rotary is all over the world.

During the plenary sessions, there were two speeches to which we need to be proactive: 1 -“Understanding Generation Y” by Michael McQueen. How to get the young involved with Rotary their way. and 2 - “Going the distance on Polio” by Bill Gates. Why we need to continue our goal to eradicate polio. We are less than \$30 million dollars away.

To summarize the convention itself, my explanation does not do it justice. There were great speakers, presentations, entertainment, wonderful people, and a commitment to do good in the local communities and around the world.

If there was one thing that I took away from attending the convention, it would have to be our Rotary emblem and the people that I met. When wearing your Rotary pin/ shirt or anything with the Rotary emblem you meet new friends, you feel the warmth, the fellowship, the commitment that you share with others no matter where you are.

So remember to wear your Rotary emblem wherever you go. We are part of a family, The Rotary Family.
