

At a time when some service club organizations struggle to attract and retain members, our Rotary Club continues to grow. Ever wonder why? I am sure there is no single answer, but some important reminders can be found in the text of our new member induction ceremony... "Honor the principles

for which Rotary stands, (the 4-way test) the commitment to service above self and the warm welcome from the extended hand of friendship." In the best sense, we have perfected the ability to combine service opportunity with the warm welcome of friendship. Rotary is the friendship we share with each other and the fellowship we create in our community. It is also important to remember that Rotary is founded on the spirit of service. Our members' involvement in our community has helped identify needs and suggest ways in which they can be met (among the examples are the Basketball Tournament, STRIVE, Rotary Readers, Channel One, Community Food Response, Ronald McDonald House Dinners). We are also very actively involved in international projects, both with financial support and hands on participation (medical supplies for Ghana, YouthLinc and the youth exchange program). In every one of these examples, people are served and lives are changed.

Each year, the Rotary International President develops a Presidential Award open for application by all clubs. This year's RI President Ray Klinginsmith based the award criteria on the four avenues of service noting the following: "Club and Vocational service help us enjoy life and be good citizens, in addition, Vocational as well as Community Service help us make our communities better places to live and work. International service permits us

to partner with clubs in other countries and on different continents to make the world a better place to live with improved opportunity for world understanding, good will and peace." In testament to the ongoing initiatives of the Rotary Club of Rochester to Rotary International's programs and priorities, we were awarded a Presidential Citation with the special commendation, "With Distinction." Currently, about 25 teenagers and 25 children participate in our

One of the most exciting parts of this ministry is watching youth who had once been angry and hostile grow to become leaders who desire to serve other and teach those younger than them.

## A reflection on Camp RYLA


