
Value of Neighborhood Trees

Right Tree, Right Place




Emerald Ash Borer

- Don't move firewood




Additional Urban Forestry Challenges

- Infrastructure Conflicts




How to Plant Trees Correctly

- Choose the right tree for the right place
- Plant for diversity
- Set tree at appropriate depth-shallow
- Avoid girdling roots-GR's kills trees
- Give extra attention in first two years- water, mulch and monitor
- Stakes/Ties


