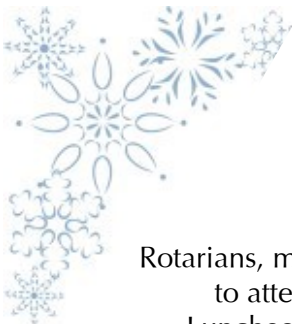

SUPPORT YOUTH IN OUR COMMUNITY THROUGH PARTICIPATION IN THE HOLIDAY CLASSIC

Thirty-two varsity basketball teams from nineteen communities will be hosted by the Rotary clubs of Rochester at Mayo Civic Center, December 29 & 30. Participants will enjoy competitive basketball and help Rotarians raise funds for the youth of our community. This 27 year old tradition will look at little different this year with the format changing from a three day tournament to a two day showcase, but the Classic steering committee believes the team building, enthusiasm for competition, and spirit of giving will remain the same.



Rotarians, local businesses, and community members have the opportunity to support the Classic in a number of ways. Sponsorships are available for between \$50 and \$1,500. This year there are two new opportunities. Bracket sponsorship is available for \$1,000, providing the sponsor with their name on all published brackets – online, newspaper, programs, event posters, acknowledgement during the games, acknowledgement in Post Bulletin, acknowledgement at awards luncheon and receipt of 2 event passes. There is also the opportunity to feature your logo on the back of a t-shirt to be given to all players. The cost for this is \$50. These are both provided on a first come, first served basis. Advertising is available for between \$100 - \$250 dollars. These ads are printed in the Holiday Classic program, distributed to those who attend the event. You don't have to be a business to advertise. Maybe you want to honor local players you know or encourage your team to do their best?! For more information about sponsorships and advertising check out the information on page 9 of this newsletter.

All Rochester Rotarians will once again be asked to support the Classic through a donation. In the past members have received two event passes. This year Rotarians will have the choice to purchase two passes or to receive a receipt for their donation, allowing it to be taken as a tax deduction. There will also be the need for many volunteers to host the tournament throughout the two days. The volunteer positions are not difficult and can be served with friends and family. Shifts will be reduced to two hours this year, so the committee encourages Rotarians to sign up for two different roles back to back or to serve one shift each day of the tournament. The Rotary US Bank Holiday Classic cannot be successful without the help of the volunteers. You're "Service Above Self" is genuinely appreciated.



Finally, Rotarians and community members are encouraged to attend the event to enjoy competitive basketball and build community. 2014 ticket prices are \$22 for an adult event pass, \$14 for a day pass, \$10 for a student event pass, and \$6 for a day pass. Attendees this year will also have the opportunity to see the new Rotary basketball court featured in the MCC Auditorium. That's something you won't want to miss. It's beautiful!

A LETTER FROM DISTRICT GOVERNOR KAREL WEIGEL FOLLOWING HER OCTOBER CLUB VISIT

October 21, 2014

Dear Paul, Elizabeth, and Fellow Rotarians from Rochester Rotary Club,

What a pleasure it was to come “home” on October 16! I couldn’t have asked for a more warm and personal welcome than the assembled menagerie of stuffed animals and the good-natured efforts of so many members who found animal themed attire to wear that day! And, several of the balloons, notably the animal prints, remain inflated!

Thank you, too, for giving me a copy of the “State of the Club” presentation you all did. I have looked through it and it’s an excellent illustration of the commitment to Rotary and leadership strength for which this club has long been known. As the fourth District Governor from Rochester Rotary let me echo what has been our collective experience, we have all been well prepared for this role because of the practical knowledge we gained here in our home club. We knew how to nurture and celebrate innovative ideas and how to resolve challenges that come (and they always do).

I appreciate the candid conversation with the Board leadership group. It is also good to hear discussion of what alternatives there are to growing membership as we seek to attract younger members and are able to welcome them with more flexible opportunities to serve and participate in both service and fellowship. The three-club support to Rotaract clubs is a great example, and while I appreciate the need for password protection, allowing access to member data may be worth a trial period to accurately assess the risk. You could for instance give Rotaract a common pass word (like the District’s “future” “your hands,” though I would use a different combination, to assure your access is still somewhat controlled. It might be worth some further discussion.



We discussed the difficulty of fully staffing service projects. The list of opportunities continues to grow but it does so inversely proportional to the list of willing volunteers. Is there any data that would help determine the most difficult projects to staff and if so, would it be beneficial assign priorities of what Rochester Rotary can commit too with some assurance we can meet the commitment? Can, or should, some be retired, or done on a revolving year basis, perhaps partner (horrors!) with Lions, Kiwanis or other Service organization to give them an opportunity expanding the volunteer base at the same time working collaboratively rather than competitively? The bottom line is to lessen the expectation on the same number of our loyal volunteers, but continue to provide good support to the community.

I remember that we did a Club Visioning session during Kim Adams year as President, 2008-2009. This is 2014, are there enough issues or concerns to consider doing that again as you plan for a future that will be different from the past and explore new opportunities by involving many of our younger members?

I know we will have good representation at the Annual Foundation Celebration on November 1, and I do hope some of you will plan to attend Midterm on January 30 (Leadership Academy) and 31 (Midterm) where we will have a membership summit. I expect some good things to come out of that.

Finally, I am looking forward to the day when I can plan on returning to the club on a regular basis. In the meantime thanks to all of you for all you do for the community and for Rotary!

HISTORY OF THE ROTARY FOUNDATION

At the 1917 convention, outgoing RI President Arch C. Klumph proposed to set up an endowment “for the purpose of doing good in the world.” In 1928, it was renamed The Rotary Foundation, and it became a distinct entity within Rotary International.

Growth of the Foundation

In 1929, the Foundation made its first gift of \$500 to the International Society for Crippled Children. The organization, created by Rotarian Edgar F. “Daddy” Allen, later grew into Easter Seals.

When Rotary founder Paul Harris died in 1947, contributions began pouring in to Rotary International, and the Paul Harris Memorial Fund was created to build the Foundation.

Evolution of Foundation programs

1947: The Foundation established its first program, Fellowships for Advance Study, later known as Ambassadorial Scholarships.

1965-66: Three programs were launched: Group Study Exchange, Awards for Technical Training, and Grants for Activities in Keeping with the Objective of The Rotary Foundation, which was later called Matching Grants.

1978: Rotary introduced the Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) Grants. The first 3-H Grant funded a project to immunize 6 million Philippine children against polio.

1985: The PolioPlus program was launched to eradicate polio worldwide.

1987-88: The first peace forums were held, leading to Rotary Peace Fellowships.

2013: New district, global, and packaged grants enable Rotarians around the world to respond to the world’s greatest needs.

Since the first donation of \$26.50 in 1917, the Foundation has received contributions totaling more than \$1 billion.

THE ROTARY FOUNDATION EARNS COVETED 4-STAR RATING

The Rotary Foundation earned a 4-star rating from Charity Navigator, the largest and most prestigious independent evaluator of nonprofits in the United States.

"Our foundation continues to operate at the highest ethical standard," said Rotary Foundation Trustee Chair John Kenny. "We are proud that Charity Navigator has recognized our commitment to accountability and transparency for the seventh straight year."

The 4-star rating, the highest that Charity Navigator awards, recognizes sound fiscal management, accountability, and transparency. Charity Navigator evaluates thousands of nonprofits each year, and only one of four earns 4 stars.

This year's top distinction marks the Foundation's seventh in a row, placing it in the top 3 percent of U.S.-based charities. In a letter to the Foundation, Charity Navigator President Ken Berger wrote, "This 'exceptional' designation differentiates The Rotary Foundation from its peers and demonstrates to the public it is worthy of their trust."
