RI FOUNDATION'S FISCAL HEALTH IS TOP-RATED BY LEADING U.S. EVALUATOR

Charity Navigator, a leading evaluator of public charities, has awarded The Rotary Foundation its top rating of four stars.

Established to help individuals make intelligent choices, the nonprofit Charity Navigator provides free ratings of tax-exempt charities based in the United

States that received substantial public support (more than \$500,000). Charity Navigator also considers length of operation and program type before including an organization on its master list for evaluation.

Currently, Charity Navigator evaluates the organizational efficiency, organizational capacity, and overall financial health of more that 5,000 charities.

"Less than a quarter of the charities we evaluate have received our highest rating, indication that The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International outperforms the majority of nonprofits in America with respect to fiscal responsibility," says Trent Stamp, executive director of Charity Navigator, in the letter announcing RI's four-star rating.

LETTER FROM CHILE!

Our youth exchange student, Tricia Anklan, has arrived in Chile. Here is a first report as sent to Karmen Reid, our youth exchange chair.

"Hopefully life is going good. I can't believe I've been in Chile for two weeks, it seems like forever but at the same time like I just got here (probably because my Spanish is pathetic, haha). The flying wasn't fun but hey nothing makes 16 hours of travel better than a 4 hour delay!

I made it to Santiago where we didn't have time to call our parents because we were rushed through customs and baggage inspection crazy quick. There were 24 exchange students in Chile through Rotary this year, 18 from the U.S., 2 from Canada, 3 from Denmark and 2 from Switzerland. Congratulations all you mathematicians, that doesn't add up to 24, and it was something like that anyways.

We had training for two days in a city North of Santiago, going there was crazy because none of us spoke Spanish and the people from Rotary didn't speak English.

I'm living in Calama, Chile. Calama is really three cities combined with about 110,000 people. My parents names are Roberto and Fabiola, and their kids are Dani 16, Roberto 16 (who is an exchange student in Pennsylvania this year, I've never met him), Monica 12 (who lives in Santiago during the school year), and Javiera goes to school with me, which is great because she actually knows what she is doing. I just pretend I do, which usually works pretty well. It's not like I can ask questions! Yesterday was my first day of school, it was really overwhelming but really fun. Today was great, I'm starting to understand the people and a couple of the classes. Oh man, except for Chemistry, last year was miserable with that class, but hey now I get to the same thing again, IN SPANISH. It is ridiculous.

Already a boy asked me for my number (ah!), I got invited to the movies and mall, invited on a trip to SanJuan, invited on a trip to Argentina, and to a barbecue this weekend! I love Chile. Everyone is so nice and interested in foreign exchange students. There are six kids in my grade already that I've met who were foreign exchange students, which is crazy cool. Chile is fantastic.
