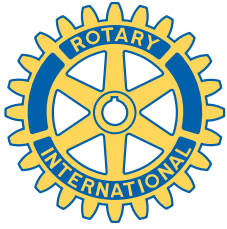

ROTARY SEEKS BUSINESS/PROFESSIONAL PEOPLE FOR EXCHANGE WITH SWEDEN, EMPHASIS ON SUSTAINABLE ECO-COMMUNITIES

A once in a lifetime opportunity! Too good to be true! A life-changing learning experience! These are phrases past participants have used to describe Rotary International's Group Study Exchange program.

Group Study Exchange (GSE) is a unique educational experience that furthers international understanding by providing an opportunity for outstanding business and



professional people to study another country, its people, its culture and its institutions. Each GSE team visits a Rotary district in another country for four weeks. Team

members stay in the homes of Rotarians, if possible, and follow an itinerary of educational and cultural points of interest. Travel and living expenses are covered during the exchange by The Rotary Foundation, host country Rotarians and Rotary District 5960.

A Rotary District 5960 GSE team will arrive in Gothenburg, Sweden, on March 4, 2009, and depart from Sweden on April 1, 2009. Rotary offers this opportunity to spend a month living with local Rotarians and seeing the country in a way few will ever experience. This exchange will emphasize the efforts underway in Sweden to develop and maintain sustainable eco-communities. Among other things, the team will explore the effect that the Swedish authored book, *The Natural Step*, has had in reducing man's carbon footprint in Sweden. Those motivated to have a beneficial impact on the earth's environmental concerns will find this exchange to be a unique learning experience.

The teams will consist of four non-Rotarian professional or business people and a Rotarian team leader. Candidates

POLITICAL CANDIDATES POLICY

"Rochester Rotary will respond to requests of major political candidates to come to our club six weeks prior to the election by our choosing a date that fits our schedule and then giving a candidate an opportunity to have lunch, make a five minute presentation, put out political brochures on the table and mingle with the membership if they desire. We will have only one candidate per meeting"

(We will assign candidates on a first come basis. First Thursday will be September 18 – please call the office – call must be made by a Rotarian)

must be engaged in a recognized business or profession on a full-time basis for at least the past two years. Employers must give permission for the candidate to participate BEFORE the interview process. Candidates must be between the ages of 25-40 years and must live or work within the limits of Rotary District 5960 and its clubs (St. Paul, Southeastern and Central Minnesota, parts of Western Wisconsin). Applicants cannot be spouses or lineal descendants of current Rotary members. Applicants must be citizens of the United States of America. **All applications must be received by your local Rotary Club by September 15, 2008, for submission to the District Office by September 30.**

District level interviews will be held on Saturday,

October 11, 2008. Applicants must be available all day, starting at 9:00 a.m. for interviews which will be held at the Northern Star Boy Scout Council's Hulings Scout Service Center, 393 Marshall Ave., St. Paul, Minnesota.

What happens for Rotation Day?

All members either host or are assigned a place to go for lunch. This goes back to the early days of Rotary when Rotarians rotated their meeting site each week. It gives you the opportunity to get to know each other a little better and find out about your host's occupation.

What is the Host's Responsibility?

Hosts sign up and give the number of members they would like to accommodate for lunch. This can vary from a minimum of six to whatever number you have room for. Hosts are given a list of names to host, and they invite their guests - giving directions, etc. They order lunches. All members have already paid for their Rotation Day lunches with their dues so all the host has to do is submit a billing to the office for the lunches.

During the meeting time, 12 – 1:30 p.m. – members can introduce themselves and the hosts can tell about their occupation and in some cases go on a tour of their facilities. They take attendance and turn it in to the office.

What to Those Attending Do?

First and foremost, **respond to the host**, let them know you are attending so they can order lunches and prepare for you. For those of you that have email, you will probably hear that way.

What if I Cannot Attend?

Please let us know you are not planning to attend so we don't assign you.
