PROGRAM:

Brent Voight introduced Kellie Cardinal, from St. Andrews in Mahtomedi, Director of Homeless housing Outreach at Guardian Angels. Kellie is the former CEO of Cardinal Aero Space in Washington DC. She is now involved in St. Andrews taking on the job of helping the church get more involved in helping the homeless. Guardian Angels Catholic Church has donated the building and St. Andrews has volunteered to administer it. There are actually 30 churches involved in Washington and Ramsay Counties. They can handle some 10 families in any given night. You would be surprised how many homeless there are in the barbs. Not so obvious as in the city, camped out in backyards, sleeping in friends houses, living in trailers parked on public land, tents etc...

It is a well rung facility, require ring daily check-ins and mainly counseling help to figure out how they can get back on their feet. They have helped 210 families since last March or 665 people. They also help those who are about to be evicted4 to prevent this from happening. Their average stay is 13 days while the county shelter is 60 days.
