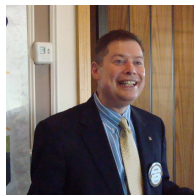

#### **PROGRAM:**

Andy Swanda of the Treehouse program presented the work of his organization with at-risk teens. The Treehouse is a non-profit organization that addresses the needs of at-risk youth. Many of the young people come from broken homes or are making bad choices about using drugs and alcohol. Treehouse opened a new program in Mahtomedi in collaboration with St Andrew's church. The program offers outreach through support groups (Tuesday nights) and faith based fun social events (Thursday) and one on one mentoring.

About 98% of Treehouse participants reported a decrease in risky behavior, 83% reported having healthier relationships and they achieved a 24% higher high school graduation rate for comparable students (free or reduced lunch criteria). The new Mahtomedi site started with 20 students and strong support from the Mahtomedi high school.
