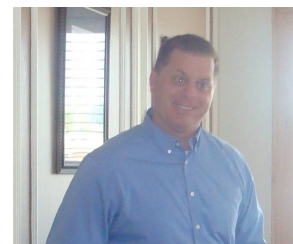
PROGRAM:



Jon Chiglo, MnDOT Chief Engineer and Jessica Wiens from MnDOT gave us an update on the St. Croix Crossing. Probably the most obvious activity on the approach to the new Bridge is the removal of the 36/95 flyover bridge to be soon followed by the replacement of the Beach Rd. Bridge. Also the south frontage road to Hwy 36 is now complete going right by Phil's Tara Hideaway down to Hwy 95. Other interesting information is that the 4th/Osgood and Greeley/Oak Green will be greatly improved beginning next year but they will not be made into overpasses. These intersections will be the major work on roads next year.

As far as the work in the water, they hope to have 5 piers in the water by next year so they can begin the superstructure. The roads on the Wisconsin side will be worked on next year as well.

We then got a detailed description of the piers being put into the river, how it is being done in wonderful detail. By the end of the year we should see 5 sets of these footings sticking out of the water. Jon is hopeful the total job can be done under 580 Million.
