PROGRAM:



Dr. Anderson has been President of Century College since 2011. He has been with Century for 7 years, previously in the financial department. He is a graduate of St. Olaf's and graduate work at the U. of Minnesota.

Century College is a combination of Lakewood College and Century College. They are on the east and west of Century Ave. One side is dedicated to more vocational training and the other is college transfer classes. It is 2 year program offering an Associate Degrees. It covers 170 acres of land and an annual budget of \$90 million, \$59 Million operating expenses. Funding is 30% state supported, the remainder from tuition etc...It provides education in many vocational fields as well as liberal arts transfers such as Arts, Science, Applied Science and Fine Arts etc...

They have 867 employees, 466 faculty and 397 staff. They have 12% of color as opposed to a student population that is 35% of color. The student body is 25% first time college, 44% are Pell eligible (measure of income level) 70% financial Aid eligible, 17% are from White Bear H.S., 17% Tartan H.S., 16% North St. Paul, 15% Forest lake and 12 % Stillwater.

They have a challenge because a great percentage are not well prepared for college. Contrary to most institutions, when the economy is bad their tuition is up. They are the biggest state college in the state. Their tuition averages \$10,721 per year. Getting an associate degree there first saves money after they transfer to the Univ. of MN (\$15,000) or Private College (\$55,000).
