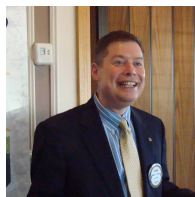

CLUB BUSINESS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS: President Dave Langer

Dave noted that a recent article in the District Gov. Newsletter talked about our Brewer's Bazaar. The text follows...

Money & Mindfulness: "In Heaven There is No Beer..." That's Why We Drink It Here were the lyrical watchwords of the annual Brewers Bazaar conducted by the **Stillwater Sunrise Rotary Club**.

President Dave Langer said, "After eight years, the event is now so popular we sold our limit of 690 tickets six weeks before the four-hour, Saturday afternoon event was scheduled." Tickets are strategically limited because the Bazaar is held on a large paddlewheeler moored on the St. Croix River. Using the boat offers a riverview venue and controls access. Attendees must be 21 or over and are "carded" at the boarding ramp. When meeting the age requirement—and recognizing Rotary's Polio Plus pursuits—participants get a "purple pinkie" relating to the national immunization days held throughout the world. "Starting with six craft brewers, we have grown to 22 brewers providing 96 different beers," added the President. Each participant receives a commemorative Rotary tasting glass with which they can sample the varied brews, talk with the brewers who are delighted to explain their craft enjoy the bratwurst, and listen to the live music." Because of our fundraising success," said President Dave, "we have been flattered by the number of non-profits in St. Croix Valley that have come to us

Asking, what do you do and how do you do it." With both ticket and raffle sales, the Bazaar is expected to net approximately \$20,000. The President stated, "Portions of the funds will go for STRIVE, a project in Costa Rica, and other local initiatives."

Dave presented Orwin with his 7-8 Paul Harris Fellowship Award.

The meeting last Tuesday regarding a cultural trip to Nicaragua went well. 6-8 people attended and showed an interest. The dates chosen were March 7-14 and applications are now welcome. The deadline is September 1.

A presentation was made to Ashley Mullenbach, a student at Stillwater Area High School, for the great year she had, from our STRIVE program.

PROGRAM:

Ted introduced Dean Van Galen, Chancellor of the University of Wisconsin River Falls. Dr Van Galen is a graduate of Univ. of Wisconsin, Whitewater and has PHD in Analytical Chemistry at Kansas State Univ. He has taught as a professor at Truman St., in Missouri and University of Florida Pensacola.

River Falls has many Minnesotans attending their school. In the commencement 3 weeks ago, 68 were graduates of Stillwater High School. Their enrollment stands at 6500 students of which 49% are from Minnesota and 50% Wisconsin. 60% Female and 40 % male. 37% of the students live on campus. Their strengths are in Dairy Science, Undergraduate Research opportunities and Global Approach. They send many students each year to a research conference, so much so they find that leasing charter aircrafts is most cost effective. On the Global front, they have had a relationship with Scotland for 27 years with exchange student opportunities. They have recently opened an opportunity in Shanghai, China. One in Five students at their school study abroad. Next year the spotlight in the school will be on Germany with lectures, food and other cultural experiences at the school.

They have recently opened up an Adult Education Center in Hudson. They are going to build a multipurpose building and are in the middle of a fund raising campaign. A recent gift of \$400,000 from the Albrights of Red Wing has gotten them off to a great start. Mrs. Albright attended River Falls.

Very interesting program, with lots of questions afterward.
