Steve Madsen introduced Lynne Bertalmio, Stillwater Library Director. Lynne is from Northern Illinois but has spent most of her life here in Stillwater.

She talked about the many changes in the library, noting the contributions of our Rotary in the capital drive to build the new addition which triples the size to the library. We hosted 3 New Year's Eve parties at the library as a means of raising funds. It ended up that ½ the funds to build the library came from private contributions and ½ from City. The result is a facility that in addition to books etc... there are meeting rooms and a balcony that are used for weddings, girl scouts, local home associations etc...

This week they are completing another renovation, combining the information and registration desks into one thus freeing up an employee to help with peoples questions. In this regard, she noted that in the day and age of digital, the library has not only been computerized but provides help to people doing a more thorough search then Google©.

She would like to see the library do more in the community, like setting up book groups and working with associations like Valley OutReach and Headstart.
