GETTING TO KNOW OUR MEMBERS:

Jeanne introduced Dave Spencer who has been a member of Sunrise Rotary for 25 years. He is married to Donna and they have two adult sons, a son-in-law and a grand-dog, all living and working in San Francisco. Dave has been a member of the Valley Chamber Chorale for 32 seasons.

PROGRAM:

Dave introduced today's speakers Calyssa Hall and Franz Hall, who gave a presentation on "**The Zephyr Theatre: Where Dreams Come to** Life." Calyssa, a resident of Afton, founded the nonprofit company that is known as Only a Dim Image Productions and she will further its

mission as executive artistic director of The Zephyr Theatre. Franz is self-employed as an IT consultant and an architectural photographer and consultant. Their organization has purchased the vacant Minnesota Zephyr Train Depot site at 601 Main St. N., in Stillwater, and plans are to convert the property into a professional theatre to be known as The Zephyr Theatre. The opening is expected to be late in 2017.

Calyssa said that their vision is to create a unique blend of theatrical and musical experiences for people of all ages. She said the goal is to become "a must-see destination" for audiences and a gathering place for artists in the St. Croix Valley and beyond. Franz talked about the building itself, which was built in 1993 and closed in 2009. He showed the Zephyr Theatre site plan and the main floor plan. The 330-seat theatre, meeting hall, and rehearsal space will also provide a venue for conventions, lectures and artistic events. A bakery, he said, will also be included, for treats during intermissions and other times. And while the plans include large changes to the depot, Franz said the theatre will retain motifs from the building's earlier days as a train station.

He noted that Stillwater was an "ideal place for our theatre" and that the Depot was an ideal location, being that it is on Main Street of downtown Stillwater and that the Zephyr Depot itself was extremely well-known in Minnesota and throughout the Midwest. He said that another positive feature was being close to the St. Croix River, so that the organization will be able to combine river cruises with visits to the theatre. Calyssa added that there is a need for more theater space here, as the closest theater at the current time is the Phipps Center for the Arts in Hudson, Wisconsin.

During a brief question-and-answer period, Calyssa and Franz said that their nonprofit's board has engaged in a two-year \$6.5 million capital campaign to cover the costs of the property's purchase, renovation and construction, as well as administrative and contingency expenses.
