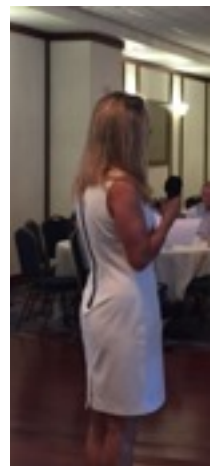
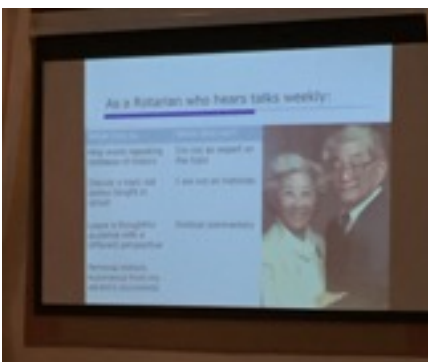
**GETTING TO KNOW OUR MEMBERS:**

Jennifer worked at the Just for Me Spa for 23 years and has been in Real Estate recently. She has dreamed to be a Tom Sawyer, a Prosecuting attorney and a professional shopper. She lives in Stillwater and has two grown children.

**PROGRAM:**

Jennifer introduced John Suzukida who talked about America's Concentration Camps, the story about the incarceration of the Japanese Americans after the attack on Pearl Harbor. John's parents this encampment which occurred beginning on December 11, 4 days after the declaration of war with Japan. His was born and raised in Skokie, Ill and as an engineer/marketing has lived for 24 years in Shoreview.

At the time the West Coast of the US was called a theater of war. Most of the collection of those of Japanese descent were rounded up in 1942. American Citizens had the name non-aliens. Between 1899-1914 Japanese were denied



citizenship and were called Nisel. John's dad came after that and was a US citizen and were called Essel. He was very involved in his community and actually wrote the John Marshall school song. However after the war broke out, graffiti was painted on their house, windows broken in their restaurant. They were sent to a camp in Granada, Colorado with only two cloth bags to put all their belongings. The accommodations were more like a military barracks. There were 10 such camps around the US. There was good news thought too, a Levi salesman who helped their family, and there was an outstanding presence of Japanese Americans in our armed services. However the remnants of the war have lingered. As late as 1957 they experienced the prejudice towards selling them a home.
