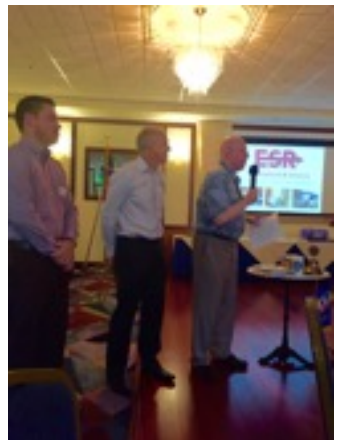
We have two new members which were introduced by Jack Gibbons after a short summary of Rotary and its aims and history.....

She has lived her whole life in Washington County, moved to Lakeland 9 years ago and recently sold her business.

PROGRAM:

Rick Robbins was born in Virginia, moved to Bemidji, MN, father of a son and daughter, a grandparent and joined Sunrise Rotary in 1995. He is the Sales Director of ESR or East Suburban Resources. ESR has 5 locations, Stillwater, Oak Park Heights, Forest Lake, Oakdale and New Richmond, Wis in process.

ESR provides many services for disabled people:

Employment, (150-160 are employed each month, some on Payroll like Fed Ex, Mennards, Boutwell's Landing Work Crews, employed by organizations like City of Oak Park Heights, St. Croix Recreational Center

Chore Services presented by Josh Reuvers, where they provide help for the elderly to stay in their homes (lawn care, snow removal and indoor cleaning). These services are also offered to paying customers at a reasonable rate. Call for rates etc... 651-342-4474

ESR also offers prevocational Training besides acting as a production center for manual jobs like punching, packing etc... some of their customers are Minnesota Lottery, K-tek and Pheasants Unlimited.
