Tim Trooien shared that next week we are in for a VERY interesting speaker. John DeSanto was a young prosecutor at the Glensheen Mansion case. He has written a book about his experiences with the case and will bring some along to sell.

GETTING TO KNOW OUR MEMBERS:**PROGRAM:**

Speaker today is Kevin Corbid, Deputy Administrator, and Washington County. Andy Haak introduced him. Previous to his current job he was the director of Department of Property Records and Taxpayer Services. He holds an undergraduate degree from Gustavus Adolphus College and a Masters in Public Administration from Hamline University. Kevin and his wife Holly live in Stillwater and have three children. Important points he made were:

- Washington County is governed by 5 commissioners that serve a 4 year term
- We are the largest population that still has a 5 member commission – most have 7
- The West side of the county has greater density; the East, more rural and less density.
- Kevin encouraged us to check out the Washington County Website where we could see charts on our demographics and diversity
- The County is responsible for public health, public works, libraries, assessing homes and licensing



centers

- Right now, WA CTY is wrapping up its strategic plan focusing on services, employment, technology, finances, and more
- A comprehensive plan will be next after the county's strategic plan. This will include 7 counties and look into the next 20 years completing in 2040.
- We are seeing three demographic faces – population growth, increasing diversity, and a greater aging community
- 80,000 more people are projected to reside in the county by 2040 with older people moving from 11% to 40%. This will be a huge impact on the county.
- Also, by 2030, it is expected that the county will be 20% people of color.
- Transportation will be of great interest and how the bridge has changed the traffic patterns of the population.
- The most calls the county receives are questions on how to use the new flashing yellow arrows!
- The County is known for its open space and natural environment. With that in mind, the County is looking at using the legacy money for other projects like the Aiple property and possibly Wilder. A new bike trail is planned for in the southern part of the county.
- Cottage Grove and Wildwood will be receiving new libraries.

A final word was a reminder to VOTE on Election Day! The County administers the voting sites and disperses absentee ballots
