Duke Pieper talked about a how he developed a blood bubble on his brain stem and the struggles and surgery to work a miracle to save his life. This was a life that showed so much promise playing hockey where he was recruited to play for the the famous Shattuck St. Mary's Academy by the famous J.P. Parise'. He was rated by Hockey USA in 2008 as one of the top 20 players in the country. And then tragedy struck. On surgery last 32 hours with teams of nurses and

doctors working on him in shifts.

After what he called 2 miracles he has recovered gone from what was predicted to be life long paralysis. He told of his stay in the hospital. He survived and went back to school and founded pieperfoundation.org.

He left us with:

- 1. Nothing is out of Reach
- 2. Keep your body in shape and you will feel good
- 3. Look around you to appreciate how lucky you are.
