ANNOUNCING STRIVE SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY FOR SENIORS



STRIVE Mentoring is awarding \$13,000 in scholarships to *six* deserving senior Stillwater STRIVE students. Four \$1,500 scholarships will be awarded on the merit of a project submitted by the student. One \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to a STRIVE student who stood out among their peers for their effort, attitude and involvement in STRIVE activities. The sixth scholarship is a very special award: a \$6,000 scholarship spread out over four years--\$1,500 each year.

-) The student's "project" must be submitted to the STRIVE Coordinator (brentv@usfamily.net, 651.470.5269) on the day of the April STRIVE meeting (April 3, 2020). If the project can be submitted electronically, it must be done so by 11:59 p.m. of that day. If the project cannot be submitted electronically, the student needs to have an arrangement in place with the Coordinator to present their project on or before the due date.
-) The student's project can be a written essay, oratory, using some form of art, or anything creative to answer the question, "If I lived by the 4 Way Test in the things I think, say and do, the result could be...(fill in the blank)" Projects that do not refer to the 4-Way Test will not be considered for an award.

SCHOLARSHIP QUALITY WILL BE BASED ON:

Clear message or purpose, formulation of thought, command of the method used, appearance

CRITERIA FOR COMPETITIVE SCHOLARSHIPS:

- Must be a senior SAHS STRIVE Mentoring student
-) Awards will be granted by the committee of Rotarians from the sponsoring Rotary Clubs.
-) If the committee deems there to be fewer quality submissions than scholarships available, they are not required to award all the scholarship dollars available for this year.

CRITERIA FOR MENTOR'S CHOICE SCHOLARSHIP:

- Must be a senior Stillwater Area High School STRIVE student
-) The winner of this scholarship will be a student who was noticed and nominated by mentors because of their unique active participation, attitude and effort.
-) The Mentor's Choice scholarship award winner may or may not be a student who applied for the competitive scholarship with a project, but a student winning a competitive scholarship will not be eligible for the Mentor's Choice Scholarship.

Announcement of the scholarship winners will be made at the May STRIVE meeting. Winners will be invited to the school-wide Scholarship Awards Ceremony in May, and the winners and their families will be invited to all three participating Rotary Club's meetings in May to be recognized by the funders of the scholarships.
