












## **Current Activity**









Lake Chad Basin

2.4 million people displaced by Boko Haram violence










## Minawao Refugee Camp, Cameroon

First opened in July 2013, it housed 7,000 refugees

By May 2015, over 44,000 were living in the camp.

Today the camp population is over 65,000.





















## Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability, Learning MEAL

150 families interviewed weeks after receiving aid

100%
Improved levels of family privacy.

99% of females interviewed Felt safer with solar lights.

98% more confident after they received training to use the ShelterBox aid.








