## FROM DESPAIR TO A BETTER LIFE



**New Patient-This is Jose Santiago.** His mother died from uterine cancer. His older sister can't look after him because she is a single mother with several children and works in a tortilla stand. His younger sister is 16 and unfortunately is pregnant and has no way to support him.

The boy is badly cared for and they only give him something to eat once a day. At times, the neighbors bring him a little extra food. Jose also has convulsions but no one has enough money to buy anti-convulsants.

Flory contacted Virgen del Socorro Hospital, a branch of Obras Hospital that takes care of orphans and disabled people who don't have families that can care for them. Jose qualifies to be accepted by them. He will have a good quality of life, medicine, therapy and be treated with dignity.

However, he first needed to have a national ID card and various health tests. and of course, a Covid test. Once these requirements were fulfilled, he would be accepted for the rest of his life. The hospital then finds a Guatemalan patron that will donate for his care.

(Flory was extremely grateful that they didn't require us to have his teeth fixed because they were really BAD! They said they will take care of having them fixed.)

Costs: \$300 for various health tests, \$150 for several nights in a hotel for him and his aunt and sister. But now he is set for life.
