Frank McElderry is a Captain with the Waukesha County Sheriff's Department and currently commands the Waukesha County Metropolitan Drug Unit, which oversees drug enforcement initiatives throughout all the municipalities in Waukesha County. By virtue of his present assignment, Captain McElderry offers a unique law enforcement perspective, which identifies the developing trends of drug abuse in the community.

Capt. McElderry has spent over 22 years serving with the Waukesha County Sheriff's Department. Prior to his current assignment, he served as a Patrol Division Shift Commander, Special Operations Division Commander (SWAT), Patrol Lieutenant, and Deputy Canine Handler.

He's very involved with the Drug Free Communities Coalition as an Advisory Board member and participates as a member of the Drug Collection Committee. Additionally, he co-chairs the Law Enforcement Pillar of the Waukesha County Health and Human Services Task Force. The purpose of this task force is to reduce heroin, opioids, and prescription drug overdose deaths in Waukesha County.

Captain McElderry holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice, and is a 2009 graduate from the FBI National Academy #238, and attended the Harvard Kennedy School of Executive Education for Leadership for the 21st Century in 2013.
