SHARING GLOBAL AND DISTRICT INITIATIVES - ENVIRONMENT

<u>ESRAG</u> is inspiring and enabling Rotarians to advocate for Environmental Sustainability in their Clubs and Districts all over the World. They recently published their updated policy statement and it's worth sharing - <u>ESRAG Policy Statement on Climate Action</u>. "In our role as one of the planet's largest and most networked humanitarian organizations, we are perfectly positioned to tackle the climate crisis; huge humanitarian costs and to rally the people and resources needed to mitigate further destruction.

It's through ESRAG that District 6600 has joined in on exciting environmental advocacy initiatives, such as Operation Pollination, the DIY Plant Rich Diet Challenge, and the Carbon Footprint Calculator. In addition, ESRAG has facilitated making connections with our Northern neighbors in Michigan and Ontario – Rotarians we share a watershed with. This partnership led to signing the Bi-National Pollinator Pledge last September to promote bolstering habitat for nature's busiest workers; as well as to our District helping to fund the Global Grant in St Thomas for a solar refrigeration system that will promote energy justice and food security while reducing carbon emissions. More recently, District 6600 Rotarians shared with neighboring ESRAG members the recipe that went into the successful 6600 tree planting project that will capture and filter nutrient-rich runoff flowing into Lake Erie. In discussions within our District, we are focused on identifying additional properties to replicate and continue this work that has measurable environmental benefits and has shown it can drive engagement and enthusiasm amongst Rotarians.

There is still much work to be done to promote biodiversity in our District. As we get closer to the growing season, it's time to start talking about pollinators again. Consider advocating for your club to start a pollinator garden, or encouraging Rotarians to plant local at home, or turn vacant business property into a prairie.
