The New Bremen/New Knoxville Rotary Club knocked it out of the park during the last week of October with their matching End Polio Now Fundraising Campaign. Club President Rob Kuenning encouraged all members to donate at least \$25 to RI's End Polio Now campaign and their donations would be matched by the Club. The combined amount was also matched with Paul Harris Points to equal 50 points. For every \$250 a member gave, it will equal a Paul Harris for them. The fundraiser generated unmatched member contributions of \$4,785, to equal a total of \$9,570 to End Polio Now. With the Gates Foundation match, that will equal \$19,140 to eradicate polio. President Rob said, "the members of our club really stepped up and did a fantastic job at supporting this fundraiser. I am extremely happy with this amount!" We are too, Rob! #### **GLOBAL GRANTS UPDATE**

District International Services Chair, Andy Bone, reports that the following grants were approved by the Foundation committee and will be funded in this 2023-2024 Rotary fiscal year:

- Training teachers in a new curriculum in Uganda, in conjunction with District 9214 in Maine.
- Rainwater harvesting in rural areas in Mexico, in conjunction with host District 4110 in Mexico and District 6780 of Eastern Tennessee.
- Mobile Dental Clinic in St. Lucia, Grenada in conjunction with host club in District 7030.
- Jalisco Kidney Transplant Program in Mexico, in conjunction with District 6790 (Tennessee) and Heart-to-Heart Network, District 4140.
- Microscopes for 180 Malaria Labs in Nigeria Rivers Area. We are partnering with Merck Biotech from Germany.
- Treatment of Muscular Dystrophy in Children in Tinnevelly, India, in conjunction with host District 3212 in India, and District 6740 in Eastern Kentucky.
- Sewing program in South Africa for underserved girls and young women. In conjunction with Women of the World, and District 6540 in Indiana.

Van Wert Rotary Club, the YWCA of Van Wert County and First United Methodist Church are happy to announce that nearly \$1,500 was raised to support women in the Van Wert Community. They would like to thank those who donated directly as well as The Well Nutrition of Van Wert who donated 10% of proceeds from featured drink sales to the campaign.

Recent data shows that 84% of teens have missed a class or know someone who has, because they didn't have access to menstrual products. Furthermore, two-thirds of the teens surveyed reported feeling stressed due to the lack of menstrual products in their school. The combined funds will be divided equally between the YWCA of Van Wert County and First United Methodist Church.
