- Reminder: October 30 is the new date of DG Ellen Hughes' official club visit. Please plan to attend; we always have a good crowd for the DG visit.

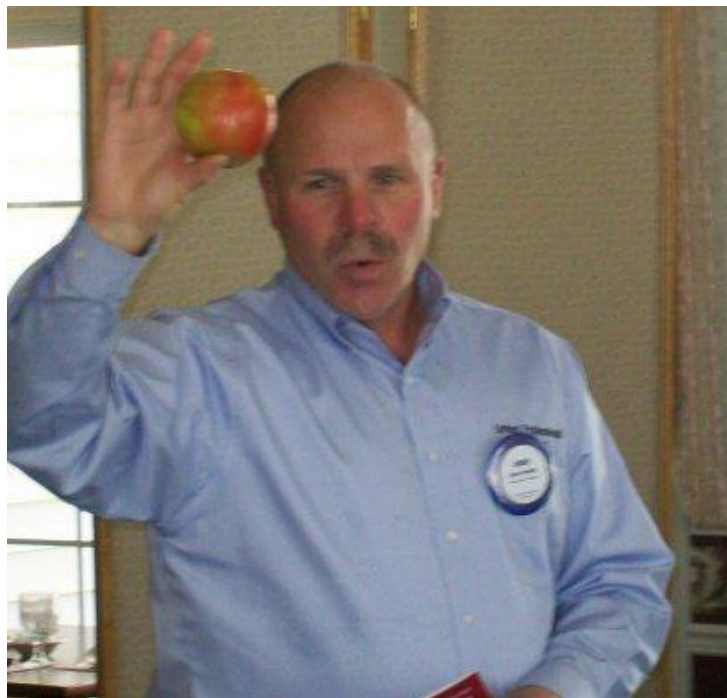
