CAN YOU NAME THIS ROTARIAN?

I was born and raised in the city that bleeds ‘Orange’. Wintertime photos shown of my younger brother and me in our youth often remind people of Ralphie and Randy from the movie, The Christmas Story.

Sports were a constant part of my life throughout my secondary school years. During the summer months, you could often find me bicycling to the local park with a ball glove dangling from a handlebar, a basketball in one arm and a baseball bat resting across the handlebars, with baseball cards, including the Mickey Mantle rookie card, flapping in my spokes, to spend the day playing ball with my friends..

In high school, I ran track and played basketball and football. In track, I was a member of several city record setting relay teams. One of my track teammates and classmates gained notoriety later in life as the former college boyfriend of current Secretary of State, Hillary Clinton. Several articles about their relationship, and time spent together in upstate New York, surfaced during the two summers the Clinton’s vacationed here in Skaneateles.

In football, I played on two city championship teams. My sophomore year, I played in a game before the largest crowd to ever witness a high school football game at MacArthur Stadium (9,000), and in my senior year I played in the same backfield with three teammates, all of whom went on to play Ivy League football. The quarterback set numerous school passing records at Columbia and played 9 years in the NFL. He is best known for being the player who replaced Johnny Unitas as the starting quarterback of the Baltimore Colts. Our fullback became the blocking back at Cornell for the Heisman Trophy runner-up and the UPI College player of the year, Ed Marinaro. The other halfback played in the most famous Yale-Harvard game, in which undefeated Harvard scored 16 points in the last 45 seconds to tie nationally ranked and undefeated Yale, 29-29. The Harvard Crimson newspaper headline the next day read: “Harvard Beats Yale 29-29.” This former teammate was also allegedly the model for the character “Michael ‘Mike’ Doonesbury” in the Doonesbury comic strip, written by his Yale classmate Gary Trudeau.

Though the fastest player on our high school football team, rather than pursue the path of my teammates, I followed a “higher calling” and entered the religious life after high school. Three years later, however, I realized that “co-eds” really did exist and came to the conclusion I would be better at offering financial advice rather than spiritual advice. This led to a change in both majors and schools, and eventually led to a career as a “moneychanger”. **Can you name me?**
