



Community Service pertains to the projects Rotarians undertake to improve the quality of life in their community. Community Service opportunities in Rotary Club of Utica include:

- Utica Municipal Housing Adrean Terrace community - summer breakfast program, school supply collection, reading program
- Hope House - cook and serve dinner to over 125 people two to four times a year
- House of Good Shepherd holiday concert
- Holiday party for special needs persons
- Monthly bingo at Pines Nursing Home
- Special projects - Abraham House spruce-up, voter registration
- Veterans outreach - identifies and addresses the needs of area military veterans

International Service describes the programs and activities Rotarians undertake to promote global peace and understanding. International Service opportunities in Rotary Club of Utica include:

- Puerto Rico Project - fund raiser for literacy, technology and physical education programs in an elementary public school
- The Rotary Foundation - helps clubs and districts work together to perform meaningful, sustainable services that help people in need around the world
- Polio Plus - community-based programs to raise funds and awareness for global eradication of polio

Youth Service recognizes the importance of empowering youth and young professionals through leadership development programs. Youth Service opportunities in Rotary Club of Utica include:

- Rotary Youth Exchange - long and short-term international exchanges for high school students
- Rotaract - club for young people ages 18-30; currently at Utica College
- Interact - club for young people ages 12-18; currently at Notre Dame Jr./Sr. High School
- Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) - an experience where high school students develop leadership skills while having fun
- Outstanding Educator Award - recognizes outstanding area high school teachers

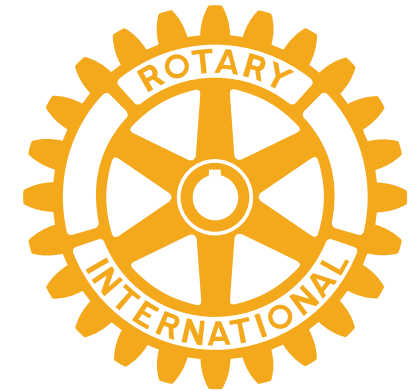

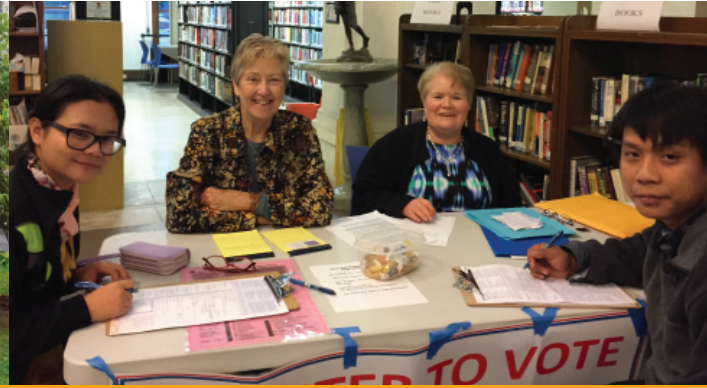

MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

Participation: To be a Rotarian means you are willing to give of your time and talents in community projects as well as in Club and District activities. Family involvement is encouraged as well as having fun!

Attendance: As an active member, you are encouraged to attend weekly meetings and/or participate in service projects or committee work related to project planning. Attending meetings or service projects held by other clubs in our district or around the world is also considered active participation.

Dues: Membership dues are \$220 a year, running July 1 through June 30. Dues support the operation of the Rotary Club of Utica, District 7150, and Rotary International. A portion of the dues income is pledged each year to the Rotary Foundation philanthropic fund. Dues income is also used to pay for training for Club members who volunteer at the District and International levels. Dues also include a subscription to the monthly *Rotarian*, published by Rotary International.

Service Fund: In place of fund raising events to support service projects, Rotary Club of Utica has established a tradition of funding its projects through voluntary contributions to our Service Fund. Each year Club members are asked to make a pledge to the Service Fund. Although not mandatory, members are expected to participate in the spirit of our funding philosophy. To meet the budgetary needs of the Club projects, we ask each member to pledge an annual gift to the Service Fund in the amount of \$160 to \$200. The Service Fund is a 501(c)(3) charity, making your pledge tax deductible.
