Clubs to clean up Sauquoit Creek for Earth Week

Rotary Club of Utica will join forces with New Hartford Rotary Club and Sauquoit Rotary Club to clean up three different areas along Sauquoit Creek. The event will take place on Saturday, April 24, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. with a luncheon starting at 12:30 p.m.

We will meet at the Washington Mills Athletic Park, 3695 Oneida Street, New Hartford. Please bring a face mask, work gloves, sturdy shoes and small plastic bags; once filled they will go into a large heavy duty green bag.

Puerto Rico Project

After hurricane Maria, club member Heather Beebe organized a fundraising campaign, including the Pasta for Puerto Rico event, that raised approximately \$2,500 towards a project to help a school in Puerto Rico. That project did not materialize due to lack of cooperation or communication with the school.

This year, the Rotary Club of Utica Board decided to try to work with a different school where I have a contact at the Luz Munoz Rivera Elementary School in Guaynabo, Puerto Rico. The school is in a neighborhood with one of the lowest number of resources in the city, with approximately 300 kids enrolled in kindergarten to sixth grade. The school suffered damages from the hurricanes and, most recently, the earthquakes. Some damages from the hurricanes have yet to be repaired, and after the earthquakes parts of the school were closed permanently or until repairs can be made.

My contact is Jorge A. Borgos, a physical education teacher, who also runs afterschool programs and other community events. Jorge and I grew up together and our families were, and still are, good friends. Jorge is a very active person in the community who is always organizing sports activities for children in Guaynabo. Every year he is able to enlist friends and family to get supplies for the school year since many, if not all, of the supplies needed for his class are not provided by the school. He also organizes volunteers to clean up and paint the school for the new year. After having several conversations with him over the years, I thought this could be a good project for our club and would benefit a community in my hometown as well as help out a friend.

If you can volunteer for this event, please forward your name to <u>Dave Jones</u>. We need a head count to order enough food for the luncheon and for the district, as this effort is part of District 7150's Water's Edge/Great Lakes Project.

In 2020, the school year was mostly held remotely whenever possible; this April 2021 students are coming back to school. Jorge's idea is to set up an activity room for the students. The room will be utilized for physical education classes and afterschool programs. The club board approved the utilization of the funds previously collected to be allocated for this project and, as a result, we were able to purchase several games and physical education materials, including the following: hockey table, foosball table, basketball game, large

chess game with 25" pieces, agility ladder, training cones, basketballs, and tennis balls.

The possible second phase of this project is to coordinate with a local Rotary club in Puerto Rico to apply for an International Grant to build an outdoor playground; more to come on that.
