This will indicate to Max's Print Shop that

the supplies are for our club's collection. With this method you do not have to pick up the supplies or drop them off anywhere. Max's Print Shop hold onto the supplies ordered and Michelle Brandstadt will pick up all orders at the end of the collection period.
