Our regular program meeting this week features Michelle Smith, program coordinator for the VA Medical Foster Home program through the Syracuse VAMC.

The meeting starts at noon Thursday, April 20, at Mid-York Library System headquarters, 1600 Lincoln Ave., Utica.

Medical Foster Home is a new program the VA wants to bring to all fourteen counties covered by the Syracuse VA. The program provides veterans with an alternative to facility placement by matching them with caregivers in the community to provide needed supervision and hands-on care. The program is currently seeking caregivers who wish to participate as a Medical Foster Home.

Michelle was previously a social worker at the VA Community Living Center skilled nursing facility as well as in primary care before taking on this new role. Michelle also has several years' experience working in Hospice care and Dementia care.

She has a masters degree in Social Work from Syracuse University, and a bachelor of arts in Human Development with a minor in Public Justice from SUNY Oswego.
