This year's beneficiary of the Service Above Self Gala proceeds is Camp Abilities of Central Association for the Blind and Visually Impaired (CABVI). Camp Abilities-CABVI is a youth development program for children and teens that are blind or visually impaired where they discover what they CAN do. The camp engages kids who have low vision to remain physically active by:

participating in leisure activities, engaging in physical education classes, using technology, and developing independent living skills that will last a lifetime. Upon arrival, participants enjoyed a delicious breakfast, including the famous VVS maple syrup, prepared and served by VVS Rotary and VVS Interact. We next gathered for the first general session, where DG Dana provided an introduction to the day as well as introduced DGE Jerry Seguin, who gave an explanation of how next year's Rotary theme, "Imagine Rotary," came to be. Updates were given on Rotary Leadership Institute by PDG Deb Glisson, youth programs by PDG Phyllis Danks, and The Rotary Foundation (TRF) and Polio by PDG Don Reese.

Breakout session topics included Public Image, Assistant Governor Training, Club Secretary Training, Treasurer Training, Membership Training (given by District membership Chair Joe Caruso), TRF and Grant Management Seminar (given by District Rotary Foundation Chair Don Reese), Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA), and Youth Exchange.

The morning ended with a final general session led by PDG Marv Joslyn, who invited everyone to participate in an interactive discussion (i.e., game) on ways to improve the "Rotary Experience" for members and perspective members.
