GreenUtica, formerly known as the Central New York Conservancy, is a nonprofit organization that has preserved, beautified, and promoted Utica's parks and natural environment for over two decades. They rebranded in 2023 to "better align with its mission to develop programs and events that enable us to lead the preservation and beautification of Utica's parks and natural environment to enhance quality of life."

Executive Director Gina Pearce joined our club at last Thursday's meeting, educating members on the organization and its work in our local community. The organization is centered around five core values: community, preservation, education, fun and beauty.

Strategic objectives include leading Utica's beautification

movement; Growing organizational capacity in three areas: revenue, staff and volunteers; Developing programs, partnerships and volunteer efforts that result in accessible, well-maintained and clean parks and green

spaces for all Utica residents; and through programming and promotion, maximize the features and investments in the local park system to promote park usage and park-related tourism.

From leading park restoration efforts, creating gardens and planting flowers on the parkway, GreenUtica has had a great impact in our wonderful city. They've also supported other organizations' efforts, including our club, helping fund our Urban Tree Planting Project, which following this fall's campaign, will have planted 100 trees in Utica.
