Just prior to joining RCIL, Katie worked at the Family Advocacy Center and provided advocacy for children with disabilities in educational settings. Katie worked closely with the students, families and members of the Committee on Special Educa-

tion to develop the best education for the success of each child.

Katie loves to empower people with knowledge and self-advocacy skills as well as provide training for families, residents, facility staff and the community on the ombudsman program and resident rights. From starting her career supporting infants, children and adolescents and now advocating for the rights of older adults, Katie has certainly had a rewarding career!
