# Meet the artist of '4 Elements Studio' art center



This week's program features Vartan Poghosian, a contemporary ceramic artist, born and raised in Yerevan, Armenia. The program gets under way at noon Thursday, Jan. 5, at the Mid-York Library.

Poghosian attended the Mkhitar Sebastatsi Educational Complex in Yerevan, concentrating in Ceramic Arts and continuing his education through mentorships. After serving in the military, Poghosian immigrated to the United States and settled in upstate New York where he began teaching and volunteering at art centers and community colleges. Starting as a ceramic studio, he founded the community art center *"4 Elements Studio"* in 2009, offering exhibition space and art classes to children, adults, immigrants and people with disabilities.

During the pandemic in 2020 Poghosian founded Clayville Pottery where he produces most of his original and production ceramic work.
