While they've had different names over the years, they've been serving the local population in the City of Utica since 1937, providing safe, clean, and affordable housing opportunities to low-income persons while "promoting self-sufficiency, upward mobility, and customer satisfaction."

Today, People First offers 12 different affordable housing properties and opportunities, including Section 8 properties, apartments for rent, houses for rent, low-income family housing units, disabled and senior housing, as well as student housing. With a team of 63 employees, People First remains dedicated to ensuring the needs of those they serve are met and that they feel "valued, prioritized, and fulfilled."
