MEETING RECAP: 'Real Life Rosies'



Real Life Rosies® is New York's first direct-entry program focused on preparing women for careers in advanced manufacturing. Offered at no cost, the program provides hands-on training in areas such as CNC machining, robotics, safety, hand tools, and lean manufacturing, while also supporting participants with job-readiness resources including assistance with clothing, transportation, and childcare. Open to individuals 18 and older who are eligible to work in the U.S., the program includes up to \$1,000 in milestone-based incentives, guaranteed interviews with up to six local employers, and the opportunity to earn na-

tionally recognized certifications like CMfgA and OSHA 10.

Real Life Rosies isn't just a MACNY program. It's in collaboration with Mohawk Valley Community College (MVCC); The Workforce Development Board, Herkimer, Madison, Oneida Counties, Inc.; and community partners, with funding from Empire State Development's Office of Strategic Workforce Development.
