Trinh Truong's Nomination Letter

Name of nominee: Sr. Elizabeth Greim

City: Utica

Activities for which the person is being nominated:

- 1. Community volunteer serving refugees from African countries through her work as a St. Vincent de Paul Daughter of Charity affiliated with St. John's Catholic Church
- 2. Volunteer Cultural Orientation Coordinator at The Center for Refugees

Essay describing the nominee:

I first met Sr. Elizabeth through as she arrived in Utica few years ago, hoping to serve the community by building programs that could serve unmet community needs. We met at the DeSales building in the Cornhill neighborhood, and I was immediately impressed by Sr. Elizabeth's approach of working hand in hand with directly impacted community members to identify and address their needs.

Sr. Elizabeth is passionate and selfless when it comes to serving the refugee community. After her arrival, she organically met the refugee families being resettled close to the DeSales center, on Summit Place, due to her proximity to the neighborhood and involvement in The Center as a Cultural Orientation volunteer. These refugees hailed primarily from South Sudan, and while they received support from The Center, sometimes it was not enough due to the extreme culture shock and language barriers they faced navigating life in America.

Sr. Elizabeth quickly stepped in and helped these families navigate complex bureaucracies, social services, taxes, and the small things, like how to send their children on the bus to school. During the pandemic, as schools shut down and these families were left to fend for themselves, she got computers and school supplies together, and set up a makeshift home learning program for the refugee students in her neighborhood, who critically depended on school learning for their integration. She also ensured that the refugees in her neighborhood received their stimulus checks, and even brought expectant mothers to prenatal appointments, waiting outside in the car and calming them down by talking through a translator on her cellphone. One time, a refugee woman on Summit Place went into labor and delivered her baby by surprise in her bathroom, and the first person she thought to call for support was Sr. Elizabeth, which goes to show how much trust she has earned.

More importantly, Sr. Elizabeth has been the friend and confidant of many, and is always looking for ways to not only support peoples' needs, but also their dreams. Upon realizing that many of these African women and families loved to sew and farm, and did not have access to a resource to practice their crafts and gardening, she reached out to me. Together, we wrote a grant to renovate the DeSales Center, and the basement is now a sewing laboratory, and there are raised beds in the neighborhood garden. She's also throwing jubilant birthday parties for the children in her neighborhood, where everyone is invited, and there are presents and cake. For a lot of these kids, it's their first birthday party in America.

The resettlement process is such a delicate one, and I have witnessed firsthand how much of an impact Sr. Elizabeth has made on the lives of the refugee families she's worked with through her selfless service. As a refugee myself, I know how important it is to have a Sr. Elizabeth in the beginning, to make things easy, and how hard it can be when you don't get that support. Sadly, Sr. Elizabeth is leaving to take on a new project later this summer in Missouri. The community will sorely miss her, but she leaves a renovated building behind, and she's helped so many families get on their feet. I know they will help other families in return, extending the legacy of Sr. Elizabeth's work of welcome.

Sister Elizabeth Greim's Bio

Sister Elizabeth Greim grew up in Boston, Massachusetts. She received a Master of Education degree from Suffolk University.

In 1996 she entered Daughters of Charity. Her ministries have combined her experience in social services and her skills as an educator through work with men, women, and children experiencing homelessness, hunger, illness and other situations of poverty and vulnerability.

She has been on mission in Richmond, Virginia; Baltimore, Maryland; Macon, Georgia; and Little Rock, Arkansas.

Sister Elizabeth returned to her roots in the northeast with her current mission in Utica, New York, where she and her sisters spend their days assisting refugees from many different countries as they settle into their new lives in the United States. The development of the Bakhita community at St Francis de Sales has grown out of the desire to be welcoming neighbors.
