"I have been involved in running concession stands for Little league in Utica and North Utica Pop Warner football for over 30 years. We recently combined all little league groups in Utica into Utica Little League. We have games at Addison Miller in West Utica, Euclid Road in North Utica, and in the north Utica park for girls softball. We also started a Challenger group for disabled persons. We have concessions at three fields. At present we are in need of volunteers at our North Utica field

for the month of June. We wonder if anyone in Utica Rotary would be willing to help us at the North Utica concession stand. Games are Monday Tuesday, Wednesday Thursday and Saturdays, weather permitting. Helpers are needed weeknights from 5:30 pm until 8:00 pm, and on Saturdays from 9:30 until 2:30. Proceeds are used to pay umpires and purchase equipment.

"We wonder if anyone would be interested in volunteering for some of the games. You need not commit to all games. We need 2 or 3 helpers for each game."
